Dear Parents,

As we approach Easter there is a lot of excitement in the school. The children are all working very hard, completing class work, trying their very best and enjoying the many elements of school life.

There has been a lot of sickness over the past number of weeks, including vomiting bugs, colds and chest infections. If your child is not well in the morning, has a temperature or has been vomiting, it is advisable to keep them at home so that they can recover fully and prevent any illness from spreading. If your child is fit, they can continue with their homework books, reading books, Reading Eggs and AR. Work will only be sent home if the child is off long term, i.e. absence of a week or more.

Work will <u>not</u> be sent if a child is on holiday during term time, an unauthorised absence.

Can I commend the children for looking so smart in their full school uniform. Skinnies/Half Zips/Hoodies/Football tops must not be worn and trainers only during PE lessons. Every other day, children should be wearing full school uniform and black shoes. Should the weather improve, children can wear plain navy shorts with their polo shirt. Gingham dresses are also not part of the school uniform.

All parents continue to use Parent Pay to book dinners and pay for all school related activities. Please be reminded that if you are entitled to Free School Meals, you must still book the dinner for your child/children. If you are having any difficulty or would like to discuss this, please do not hesitate to get in touch. It is recommended that parents log on a Sunday and book dinners for the week ahead and settle accounts. There are also some outstanding accounts for dinners, World Book Day and Term 2 Coaching. Unfortunately, this prevents Anne and Niamh in the office from reconciling accounts at the end of each month.





Gareth from AB Coaching is continuing to take each class for coaching and skills development this term. Thank you to everyone who already paid towards this on Parent Pay. It is only fair that we get the support from all parents towards the cost of the coaching. If you do not want your child to participate, please contact the school.
